# Lesson 6 Part 1 – Path to Spiritual Maturity (The Beatitudes)





#### **COMMENTARY**

- The **Beatitudes** are **eight (8) blessings** recounted by Jesus in the Sermon on the Mount in the Gospel of Matthew.
  - > "Blessing" means to be fortunate, well off, happy.
  - The number "8" in the Bible represents a <u>new</u> <u>beginning</u>, meaning a <u>new order or creation</u>, and man's <u>true 'born again'</u> event when he is <u>resurrected from the dead</u> into <u>eternal life</u>.

### SCRIPTURE READING



- **Point 1:** You do not know how, nor do you have the power to achieve these blessings on by your own abilities.
- **Point 2:** Christ offers you the blessings, but He does not just turn it over to you to figure it out.
- Point 3: He will take your hand and guide you, by means of the Holy Spirit, give you the knowledge and power to accomplish each and every requirement.
- Point 4: If you humble yourself and with it, obtain a "teachable heart" the Holy Spirit will give you "much spiritual fruit" – the "Fruits of the Spirit".



- Happy Will Those Be Who Are Humble and Give Up Their Prideful Nature:
  - Happy Will Those Be When They Know Who They Are in Relation to God.
  - Happy Will Those Be When They Realize They Need God For All Things.
- Happy Will Those Be Who Abide In Christ For All Things.
- Happy Will Those Be Who Have Faith (Trust) In Christ to be Their Lord.

### **Humility (Christ)**

- ☐ The Son can do nothing of Himself. *John 5:19*
- I can of My own self do nothing; My judgement is just, because I seek not Mine own will. John 5:30
- ☐ I receive not glory from men. John 5:41
- ☐ I come not to do Mine own will. John 6:38
- ☐ My <u>teaching is not</u> Mine. *John 7:16*
- ☐ I am not come of Myself. John7:28
- ☐ I do nothing of Myself. John 8:28
- I have not come of Myself, but He sent Me. John 8:42
- I am not seeking glory for myself; John 8:50
- ☐ The words I say, <u>I speak not from Myself</u>. *John* 14:10

### Pride (Man and the World)

I don't need you or anyone. I can do it myself. You should be giving me the credit. I don't care about what you want. Give me enough time and I can figure out almost anything. Don't blame me. It's not my fault. I'm not going to bow down to anyone. I'm going to teach him a lesson or two. I'm don't take crap off anyone. I'm not going to him. He's going to have to come to me if he wants anything. I don't need anyone to speak for me. Nobody is going to disrespect me.

(Matthew 5:1-12)

#### TRUE HUMBLENESS:

- Renders us teachable and leads to servitude...It's the "Softening" of Our Hearts To Receive Christ.
- Enables us to receive prosperity or adversity, health or sickness, ease or pain, life or death, with an equal mind and trusting (Faithful) and hopeful (Believing in God's Promises) Heart.
- Opens our hearts to receive God's Grace (Favor).
- FOR IF WE RECOGNIZE OR SPIRITUAL POVERTY, the riches and resources of the Kingdom of Heaven are opened up to us to have and enjoy. These riches are not for the prideful, or on the bases of earthly wealth, race, or the powerful. It's made for the poor in spirit, those who are spiritually bankrupt, and recognizing their need for God.

ANSWER: We regret and have sorrow or grieve for:

- Our sinful nature and inclination to disobey God.
- The sinful nature of others
- Unbelievers and their destiny,
- The wickedness of the world, its evil ways, deceptions, and lies.
- The those who do not know the truth and are heading to destruction and eternal death.

FOR IF YOU MOURN, You will be comforted in your time of need, and freed from all the troubles of this life. They shall be blessed with uninterrupted communion with the Father, Son, and the Holy Spirit, and with happy society of the angels and glorified saints.

### Blessed Are The Meek, For They Shall Inherit the Earth

(Matthew 5:1-12)

- ANSWER: To be "Meek" means to have a heart of servitude. It is to have self-control, joy, long-suffering disposition, tolerance, and a tranquil heart.
- It is putting ourselves last in the world's eyes, but first in God's eyes.
- FOR IF WE ARE MEEK, God watches over us while here on earth, ensuring we don't end up on the short-end of the stick.
